



Faculty Position in Family and Consumer Sciences Education

The Department of Child Development and Family Relations at East Carolina University (ECU) invites applications for a 9-month tenure-track position in the Family and Consumer Sciences Education program available starting August 16, 2010. Review of applications will begin March 1 and continue until the position is filled.

Responsibilities: Teach undergraduate and graduate courses; advise students; supervise graduate work; develop and maintain an active research program; serve as program coordinator, secure external funding, and provide service to the profession, community, and university.

Qualifications: Applicants must hold a doctorate in family and consumer sciences, vocational educational, or a closely related teacher education field of study. Experience with intern supervision, online teaching, and action research supervision preferred. Program coordination or program administration experience is desirable. Candidates should hold or be eligible to hold a North Carolina family and consumer sciences teacher license. Successful candidates must be committed to working with diverse student and community populations.

The Department of Child Development and Family Relations is one of six departments in the College of Human Ecology. It has approximately 600 full-time students and 150 licensure only students enrolled in the undergraduate programs of family and community services, birth-kindergarten teacher education, family and consumer sciences education, and child life. An additional 85 students are enrolled in the Master's programs of child development and family relations, birth-kindergarten teacher education, family and consumer sciences education, marriage and family therapy, and the Ph.D. in medical family therapy.
