Temporary, part-time, and prior start faculty are invited to participate in portions of the program pertinent to them and that they have not already completed.

It will begin with the faculty chair and faculty senate officers who will share information and perspectives about the Faculty Manual, teaching assignments, and teaching policies and procedures. A panel including the Registrar, Disability Support Services, Student Rights and Responsibilities, and Advising will discuss assistance and issues, including reporting grades and making accommodations. Following this panel, faculty will be asked to review syllabi in light of university requirements and discuss recommendations.
