- Committee members noted that the course could be repeated for credit with a change of topic and asked whether there should be a limit on the maximum number of credits that could be counted. D. Jordan explained that they had considered setting a limit but decided to leave it open because these types of courses are good for testing out new courses for development.
- 2. Objectives: revise #3, #4, and #6, because these read more like assignments than objectives.
- 2. RCTX 4903 Special Topics in Recreational Therapy
  - Objectives revise any objectives that read more like assignments.

Motion to approve the package as amended was made by S. Weiss and seconded by N. Spalding. Motion passed.

# College of Health and Human Performance Department of Kinesiology (Jeff Pizzutilla, Susannah Berry)

Overview: The department faculty request these changes to the Physical Education, BS to bring that degree down to 120 s.h., which will bring it into compliance with the mandate from the UNC System Office for undergraduate degree credit hour limits.

- 1. Memorandum of Request
  - 1. No changes required.
- Revision of Existing Courses: KINE <u>2123</u>, <u>2900</u>, <u>3540</u>, <u>3900</u>, <u>3906</u>, <u>4323</u> (*Level 1*)
  - 1. KINE 2123

- Objectives: #5, correct spelling error for "discuss"; #3, remove "be able to"
- 2. Committee members questioned the information contained in the "Note" field, in which 16 clock hours of directed observations and planned participation is specified, and asked whether that was too much for a 2-credit course. S. Berry explained that it was a requirement that was not tied to credit and there were several other courses in the college that had the same requirement but were just 1 credit.

### 2. KINE 2900

1. Committee members noted that the prerequisite was described in the justification as "KINE 2123 and consent of instructor" but was entered in the prerequisite field as "KINE 2123 or consent of instructor". The justification was amended in the meeting to match the information in the prerequisite field.

### 3. KINE 3540

1. Committee members noted that part of the package involved removing KINE 2000 from the degree requirements, and yet the program was allowing the choice between that course and KINE 2123 as a prerequisite in this course proposal. J. Pizzutilla explained that KINE 2000 was still required for one of the other program areas, and this course is also required of majors in that program area. They wanted to make sure this course was available to those majors and physical education majors. He noted that there was a package coming through to revise KINE 2000 that would further restrict it so that non-majors would not automatically be able to take the course, though he was not certain it would really be necessary. J. Pizzutilla indicated the

department would monitor enrollments to see whether it was an issue.

Committee members suggested that the department could restrict one section to majors only.

### 4. KINE 3900

 Objectives: remove "student will be able to" from sentences

### 5. KINE 3906

1. No changes required.

### 6. KINE 4323

- Justification: Add the title that the course is being changed from to the same sentence that introduces the new name.
- Committee members asked whether the information in the prereq/coreq field was actually needed, because the information in the prerequisite field included upper-division standing. J. Pizzutilla acknowledged that the information could be removed.
- 3. Revision of an Existing Degree: Physical Education, BS (Level 3)
  - 1. Committee members noted that in Section 5, a maximum of 6 s.h. may count toward general education requirements – but students have to be very careful of which 6 hours are used from that concentration. In order to make the degree hours total correctly, the heading of section 5 should be revised to read as a range between 12-18, and the 6 hours that are General Education may need to be specified. S. Berry noted that the 18 hours were from a section that was outside of this department's degree and were regulated by the College of Education. She also voiced concern that they may have to keep it listed at 18 for licensure requirements. The committee advised J. Pizzutilla to consult with Vivian Covington of the College of Education to check whether that heading could reflect a range, but acknowledged that the degree form would need to be tabled until that information could be confirmed.

Motion to approve the course forms as amended and to table the degree revision was made by K. Vail-Smith and was seconded by N. Spalding.

College of Business
School of Hospitality Leadership
(Steve Myszak, Stephanie Bae)

Overview: The program conducted a careful study of their curriculum when the mandate to reduce degrees to 120 s.h. came from the UNC System Office, and the requested changes are the results of the effort to comply with that policy.

  - Committee members asked that the department rephrase part of justification that alludes to concentration, because the sentence was unclear. They also asked why the courses are being banked, rather than deleted. S. Bae explained that the department wanted to make sure the courses were not needed before deleting, because they had content that could conceivably be reused in the future.
- 3. Revision of Existing Courses: HMGT <u>2591</u>, <u>3300</u>, <u>3990</u>, <u>4244</u>, <u>4300</u>, <u>4301</u>, <u>4308</u>, <u>4440</u>, <u>4450</u>, <u>4650</u>, <u>4700</u> (*Level 1*)
  - 1. HMGT 2591
    - Course objectives: revise any that are assignments to be objectives and make sure to use measurable verbs.
    - Course assignments: revise the assignments to reflect the course objectives.
    - Course assignments are in points and grades are reported as percentages, so please add the points in the grading section as well.

# College of Fine Arts and Communication School of Music (Chris Ulffers, Cynthia Wagoner, Judy Barber)

Overview: This package was submitted to correct an omission made in a previous package. Course revisions forms for MUSC 1186, 2176, 2186 proposal forms were not submitted as part of a previous package to make necessary edits to the prerequisites and corequisites of several courses, and those courses should have been part of that package.


Motion to approve the package as amended was made by K. Vail-Smith and seconded by D. Jordan. Motion passed.

College of Fine Arts and Communication School of Music (Chris Ulffers, Cynthia Wagoner)

Overview: This package is the result of efforts to reduce these programs to 120 s.h., in compliance with the mandate from UNC System Office. The faculty of the school made use of the policy for double counting to bring the credits down, but it resulted in 119 credits. This afforded them the opportunity to increase credit hours for a course with global diversity credit. The degree is complex, and some of the changes required the submission of proposals to the General Education and Instructional Effectiveness Committee (GEIEC).

  - The committee requested that the information about the changes made to the courses for purposes of getting the general education designation be removed, and that just the changes to the courses and programs be listed.

The recreation and park management (RPM) program is accredited by the Council on Accreditation for Recreation, Parks, Tourism, and Related Professions. Students who want to declare a major in recreation and park management at the time of entrance into the degree need to have completed 30 s. h. of coursework at ECU or in transfer credits; possess a minimum overall GPA of 2. 0; and have met with an adviser advisor in the Health and Human Performance Advising Center (located in the Belk Annex). Following admission, the student is required to schedule a meeting with his or her RPM faculty advisor. Students majoring in recreation and park management must maintain a minimum cumulative 2. 0 GPA and a minimum cumulative 2. 0 overall GPA in all core and restricted elective courses to remain in good standing. Majors must earn a minimum grade of C (2.0) C- in all required core RCLS prefix courses. If a course without the RCLS prefix is approved as a substitution for a required core RCLS prefix course, a minimum minimum grade of C (2.0) C- must be earned. Students Stu dents dropping below the required 2. 0 GPA will not be allowed to enroll in any additional RCLS prefix courses until the GPA meets the 2.0 requirement. If a student receives a grade lower than a C (2.0) C- in a required core course, the student may re-take that course without meeting the 2. 0 GPA requirements. Students graduating from the RPM program are eligible to sit for the national examination to

become a Certified Park and Recreation Professional (CPRP) and thereby acquire this valuable credential for professional advancement.
