Attached you will find requests for two course revisions and a request to add a post-master's certificate in nursing leadership. An overview of these requests follows:

Revision of NURS 6977 and NURS 6978

Students who chose to pursue the MSN Nursing Leadership concentration can focus in acute care, community-based, or nursing educational leadership. NURS 6977 and 6978 are the practicum or clinical courses for the MSN-Nursing Leadership concentration. During these courses students are placed with a nurse executive that serves as a preceptor for a 126 hour onsite experience in a facility that reflects the focus area of the student. When these two courses were originally designed the concentration did not have these focus areas, so the language of the objectives were oriented to acute care leadership. The new language is more generalized and applicable in any of the three settings.

Post Masters Certificate in Nursing Leadership

The MSN Nursing Leadership concentration is the only concentration in the College of Nursing that does not offer a Post Masters certificate program. We have had an increasing number of requests for this certificate program as the health system has become more complex and economically driven. Nurse Practitioners, Clinical Nurse Specialists, and Nurse Educators moving into leadership roles will be able to pursue this post-master's certificate to gain educational competency in the management of financial and human resources. A detailed overview of the certificate program is provided.

OVERVIEW OF POST-MASTER'S CERTIFICATE IN NURSING LEADERSHIP

<u>Statement of Educational Objectives</u>: The post-master's certificate in nursing leadership prepares nursing professionals to serve as leaders within multiple settings and specialty areas. Students may choose from one of three foci for specialization: Leadership in Acute Care Health Systems, Leadership in Community-Based Health Systems, or Leadership in Health Care Educational Systems. All nurses who earn this certificate acquire knowledge and practice in administrative and organizational theory and ethics, financial management, and human resource management. Other courses are based upon the specialty focus and prepare the nurse for the particular leadership demands of that system. This post-master's certificate is offered 100% online.

<u>Admission Requirement</u>: Admission to the post-master's certificate option requires the student to meet the minimum admission requirements for graduate study of the university and the following requirements of the College of Nursing:

- A master's degree in nursing from a nationally accredited nursing program
- Current non-restricted license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in North Carolina or a NCSBN compact state
- A one-page personal statement describing the applicant's interest in graduate study, career goals, and the certificate's relationship to those goals
- Three professional references, with one reference from an individual who is knowledgeable of the applicant's nursing practice
- One year clinical experience as a RN
- A personal interview with a member of the graduate faculty

Statement of Course Sequence: See attached

Statement of how proposed course sequences meet educational objectives:

Courses offered through the certificate program provide students with leadership education in the areas of financial and human resource management as well as administrative and organizational theory. This provides a basic framework for leadership competency. Additionally, courses required for the focus area in the masters program are also required for the post-masters certificate in nursing leadership.

Statement of the need for the proposed program: The College of Nursing has received a number of requests by interested students to consider the development of this post-master's certificate program. Additionally, a review of regional Colleges of Nursing that were offering an administrative masters also offered a post master's certificate in administration. MSN prepared nurses with a clinical focus often have a career trajectory which leads to a leadership or management position. These nurses, while expert clinicians, need additional advanced preparation in leadership.
