Enclosed please find several documents relative to the request for changing the name of the master's degree offered in the Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders, College of Allied Health Sciences.

On June 10, 2008 the graduate faculty in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders met and approved a name change for the master's degree in this department. Currently, the master's degree is in Speech Language and Auditory Pathology (SLAP). The graduate faculty voted to change it to Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSDI). As Dr. Givens' memo indicates, this degree name better identifies the degree content and more appropriately represents the master's degrees offered in the department. The content of the degree remains unchanged; this is only a name change.

This name change is necessitated by the change in required degree for the profession of audiology. In the past both speech-language pathology and audiology required a master's degree and thus, the SLAP name was appropriate. However, audiology now requires a doctorate and the master's degree for speech-language pathology is no longer appropriately represented by SLAP. The CSDI name more closely reflects the content of both the clinical speech-language pathology track and the communication sciences track. There is no CIP code change requested as the focus of the degree is not changing.

This degree name change would better reflect the overall content of the degree and be more effective for marketing the degree. We are not changing the content or the focus of the degree.

In the past, students earning an MS degree in audiology or speech-language pathology earned the SLAP degree. The audiology profession now requires a doctorate as the entry level degree, and there are no longer any accredited MS programs. Recently, CSDI established a Clinical PhD in Audiology to adhere to accreditation standards and replace the MS audiology concentration.

The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders Graduate Studies Committee met on June 10, 2008 and voted to approve the new degree program name.
