Does the discontinuation of the program involve the discontinuation of an off-site or online delivery of the program? NO, it is only offered on campus in Greenville.
If the program to be discontinued is offered at off-campus sites, please list them. (NA)
Why is this program being discontinued? This certificate is being discontinued because student demand for this certificate has not been sufficient to merit the very niche classes it requires. Since electronic records were kept in 2006, no students have completed the baccalaureate or masters level certificate. We feel that if we offer a certificate, we must reliably offer the courses for its completion. Otherwise, we may recruit students or peak their interest in this offering and then they will find themselves unable to complete the certificate in a timely fashion. We want to avoid any mention of this certificate in ECU materials, catalogs etc. so that prospective students do not experience a "bait and switch" upon arrival. Students interested in aquatic management can still pursue research agendas in this area and components of aquatic management are still offered in the coursework (RCLS 5111 Facility Management and RCLS 5001 Aquatic Management). However, the complementary courses required to complete the certificate will not be offered (and have not been for some time). No current students are enrolled in this certificate program. No faculty member requires reassignment as a result of this change.

I respectfully request authorization to discontinue the Certificates in Aquatic Management administered by the Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies. The details of this request are provided on the attached form: UNC Appendix D: Request for Authorization to Discontinue a Degree Program. A summary is provided below.

A Certificate in Aquatic Management has been available for B.S or M.S students. Since electronic records have been maintained, no students have completed the certificate and no students are in progress in these certificate programs. Courses are not offered reliably and student demand has not been sufficient to warrant specific courses required to complete the certificate. As such, we would like to remove all mention of the Certificates in ECU documents and catalogs so that we accurately portray what is offered to prospective and current students.
