
Driver's Education Add-On License

THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH EDUCATION AT EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY

In order to be licensed by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, an individual must have a license in some other teaching area and add Driver Education to an existing teaching license. To do so, an individual must complete 12 semester hours. General the courses will be offered as follows:

DRED 2000	Introduction - - Driver Education (3)
DRED 2330	K-12 Safety Education (3)
DRED 3309	Advanced Driver and Traffic Safety Education (3)
DRED 3320	Advanced Driver Education (3)
DRED 3321	Lab Programs in Driver and Traffic Safety Education (3) (taken in conjunction with DRED 3320)

These courses are now available electronically through the Division of Continuing Studies. DRED 2000 and 3039 will (currently) be offered **by permission only** during the fall semester. DRED 2000, 2330, 3320, 3321 will also (currently) be offered **by permission only** during the spring semester. The enrollment for DRED 2000 and 2330 will be open during the (2nd) summer term.
