III. Expanded Course Description
<p>The goal of the course is to provide students with a working knowledge of the principles, concepts and analytical tools of corporate finance that will allow them to understand the overall importance of proper financial management to the success of a business. This includes emphasis on decisions related to capital structure, working capital management and capital budgeting.</p> <p>Pre-requisites for this class are: ACCT 6221 or FINA 6144</p>

<p>Students who successfully complete the course will understand and be able to apply financial management techniques in the primary areas of financial control, capital budgeting, working capital management, capital structure management, dividend policy and other areas - including both historical analysis and the planning/control issues related to the dynamic business world.</p>
