The East Carolina University Summer Choral Camp opens its doors to all rising seventh-grade through twelfth-grade singers desiring the opportunity for great music-making, great friendship, and great fun. Singers will have the opportunity to work with ECU School of Music faculty and choral music educators from eastern North Carolina. The ECU Summer Choral Camp emphasizes total musical development through a broad range of musical activities that serve to strengthen vocal skills, music reading, and aural perception of music. Large and small ensemble rehearsals will be conducted by Dr. Crane and other camp faculty throughout the week, culminating in a public concert. Students can choose to stay for the week on the ECU campus or to commute from home. Additionally, students can choose from a wide range of musical electives:

A Typical Day in the Life of ECU Summer Choral Campers

Campers will be accompanied by a full staff of experienced camp counselors throughout the day.

Summer Choral Camp Application Process and Fees

Resident Camper: \$390

Includes all meals, housing for five nights, insurance, use of materials, instruction, and all recreation activities.

Day Camper: \$240

Includes lunch each day, insurance, use of materials, instruction, and all recreation activities.

Voice Lessons

Campers have the opportunity to take private voice lessons with ECU faculty. Private lessons are an additional fee of \$30 per lesson. The student must indicate interest on the application and two pieces he/she has previously prepared for the lesson. Students must pay tuition in full by May 15, 2012 to take private voice lessons.

Scholarships

It is the goal of the ECU Summer Choral Camp to attract the best and brightest choral musicians. To that end, partial scholarships are available to students participating in select honors choirs in the 2011–2012 school year. A limited number of scholarships are available for students who participate in the following choirs:

- All-County or All-District • All-State
- *NC or VA Honors Choir • ACDA National Choir

To apply for a camp scholarship, students should send an entire concert program (original or photocopy) with the student's name highlighted. The concert must have occurred in the 2011–2012 school year. Students are only eligible for one scholarship, as funds are available, even if they participate in multiple honors choirs. Specific scholarship amounts will be determined by the camp director, and range between \$50 - \$225, depending on the student's experience and background. *Other states may be eligible for the "Honors Choir" scholarship.

Camp Accommodations

Resident campers will live in a coeducational university residence hall. At all times, a full staff of adult counselors will carefully supervise students, and health facilities are available. Campus Dining Services will provide three meals a day.

Application Process

Students seeking a partial scholarship must complete an application and send an original or photocopied concert program by **April 15, 2012**. Students will be notified of a scholarship offer by May 1. Full tuition payment is due by **May 15, 2012**. Students who are not seeking a partial scholarship must still complete an application and include full tuition payment by May 15, 2012.

Tuition Payments

Full tuition payment is due by **May 15, 2012**, of which \$100 is nonrefundable. Payments made after May 15 will be charged a \$35 late fee. No tuition is refundable after June 15.

Dr. Andrew Crane joined the ECU School of Music in 2011 as Director of Choral Activities, having previously served in the same position at California State University, San Bernardino, where he received the College of Arts and Letters Outstanding Teaching Faculty Award. Choirs under his direction have appeared

by invitation at conventions of the American Choral Directors Association, California Music Educators Association and the Southern California Vocal Association. Crane is also the former choral director at Provo High School (UT). He is active as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator of choirs throughout the United States. Additionally, Crane performs frequently as a tenor soloist in the choral/orchestral repertoire, and has appeared with such groups as the Los Angeles Bach Festival, Lansing (MI) Symphony Orchestra, San Bernardino Symphony, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, and with orchestras in Italy, Austria, and Hungary. He has published articles and reviews in Choral Journal and Classical Singer. Crane is an active member of the American Choral Directors Association and the National Collegiate Choral Organization. He received the Doctor of Musical Arts from Michigan State University, and BM and MM degrees from Brigham Young University.
