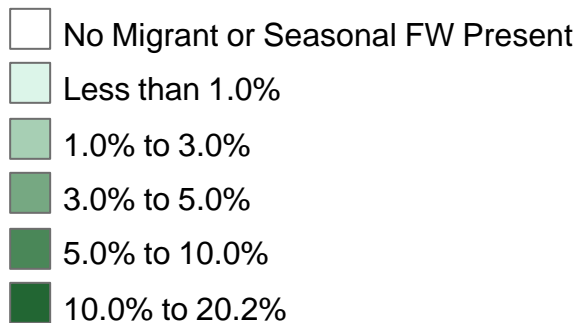
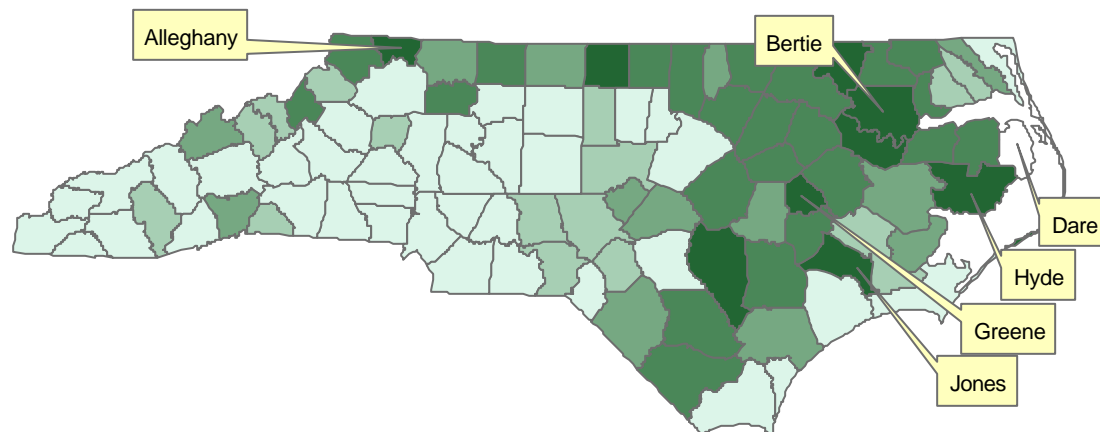


Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Populations 1993-1998 Period Estimates¹

Migrant/Seasonal Farmworkers with Non-Farmworkers²



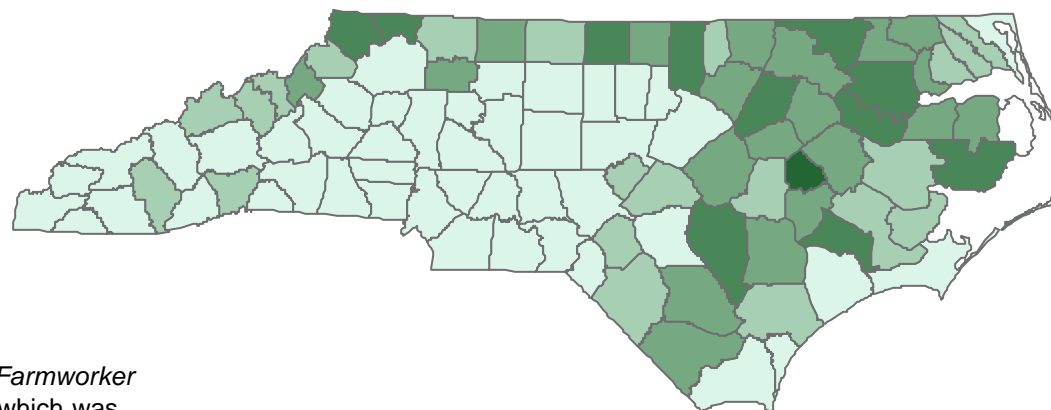
