The elementary education program at East Carolina is nationally recognized for innovation and effectiveness in preparing knowledgeable, informed, and professional teachers. As a student here, you have multiple practicum experiences during methods classes, working side by side with master classroom teachers and university supervisors. You gain valuable classroom teaching experience as you prepare lessons and teach children in local area elementary schools with the support of clinical teachers and university professors.

### UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE

The BS degree requires foundations curriculum and professional courses totaling 128 hours. The elementary education (ELEM) degree outline is very specific for foundations curriculum courses. Advisors help you tailor your individual schedule to ensure that you are completing necessary degree requirements. The elementary education Web site provides more detailed information on program requirements for the undergraduate degree in elementary education. The BS in elementary education program is offered both on campus and by distance education through Wachovia Partnership East (WPE). ### GRADUATE DEGREE

The elementary education MAEd 36-semester-hour program generally takes candidates two years to complete. You complete a set of core courses (12 hours) required for all MAEd students. You choose additional course work from one of four strands: content pedagogy, teacher leadership in the elementary school, early childhood, or academically gifted. Courses are offered in both face-to-face mode and in online formats, depending on the course and the semester in which courses are offered. Face-to-face courses are taught in the evenings during the fall, spring, or summers. A check sheet of required courses can be found on the elementary education Web page. ### GRADUATE CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES

- The **assistive technology graduate certificate program** is built upon a partnership between the special education program area and the Department of Occupational Therapy. The 12-hour online certificate may be pursued as part of a master's program or independent as a nondegree graduate program.
- The **autism graduate certificate program** offers an innovative online opportunity to learn more about the unique educational needs of individuals with autism and autism spectrum disorder. The 12-hour certificate program focuses on research-based strategies and interventions in identification, instruction, and communication.

- The **academically gifted licensure program** is offered in collaboration with the elementary education program at ECU to prepare you to work with students identified as academically gifted.

### LICENSURE

If you have a degree from an accredited four-year university, you are eligible to enroll in the licensure-only programs. Many classes are offered online and late in the day, enabling you to take classes at your own pace and from off-campus sites.
