The College of Education at ECU offers programs that prepare leaders in their fields. If you are interested in fulfilling your professional goals as an expert in literacy and literacy instruction, the reading program area in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction has the right choice for you.

Within the reading program area (READ) at East Carolina, you can choose from reading courses that are included within many programs (including the elementary education and special education programs). You also can take course work leading to North Carolina A-level and M-level reading licensure, as well as the MAEd in reading education degree (MAEd-READ).

Within READ courses, you and your classmates gain understanding about how to teach students to read. You have opportunities to apply your understandings as you work with students in multiple classroom settings. Districts throughout the state and nation report that the addition of reading licensure or an MAEd-READ degree increases your competitiveness as a job candidate no matter where you apply for employment.

GRADUATE DEGREE

The 39-hour MAEd-READ program generally takes candidates two years to complete. As a student in the program, you will complete a set of core courses (12 semester hours) required for all MAEd students. In addition, you will complete courses within a reading educational professional core, including a variety of practicum teaching experiences within school settings.

All courses are aligned with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction's Master's-Level Reading Standards, as well as International Reading Association Standards for Reading Specialists and Literacy Coaches. MAEd-READ courses are offered in both face-to-face mode and in online formats, depending on the course and the semester of offering. READING LICENSURE

If you are a student with a degree from an accredited four-year university, you are eligible to enroll in the licensure-only programs. Many classes are offered online and late in the day, enabling you to take classes at your own pace and from off-campus sites. READING CEU MODULE PROJECT

North Carolina teachers in grades K–8 must complete three CEUs in reading methodology in order to be certified. Teachers may register individually, or school systems/individual schools may reserve entire modules allowing teachers to work collaboratively on the strategies and tasks involved. Each module was developed by a team of one ECU faculty member and one master public school teacher. Each module requires about ten hours of work to earn one CEU credit toward license renewal.

The modules address various topics and are delivered completely online through ECU's online course management system, Blackboard. Before registering for a module, check with your LEA's licensure specialist or building administrator for prior approval of CEU course work.
