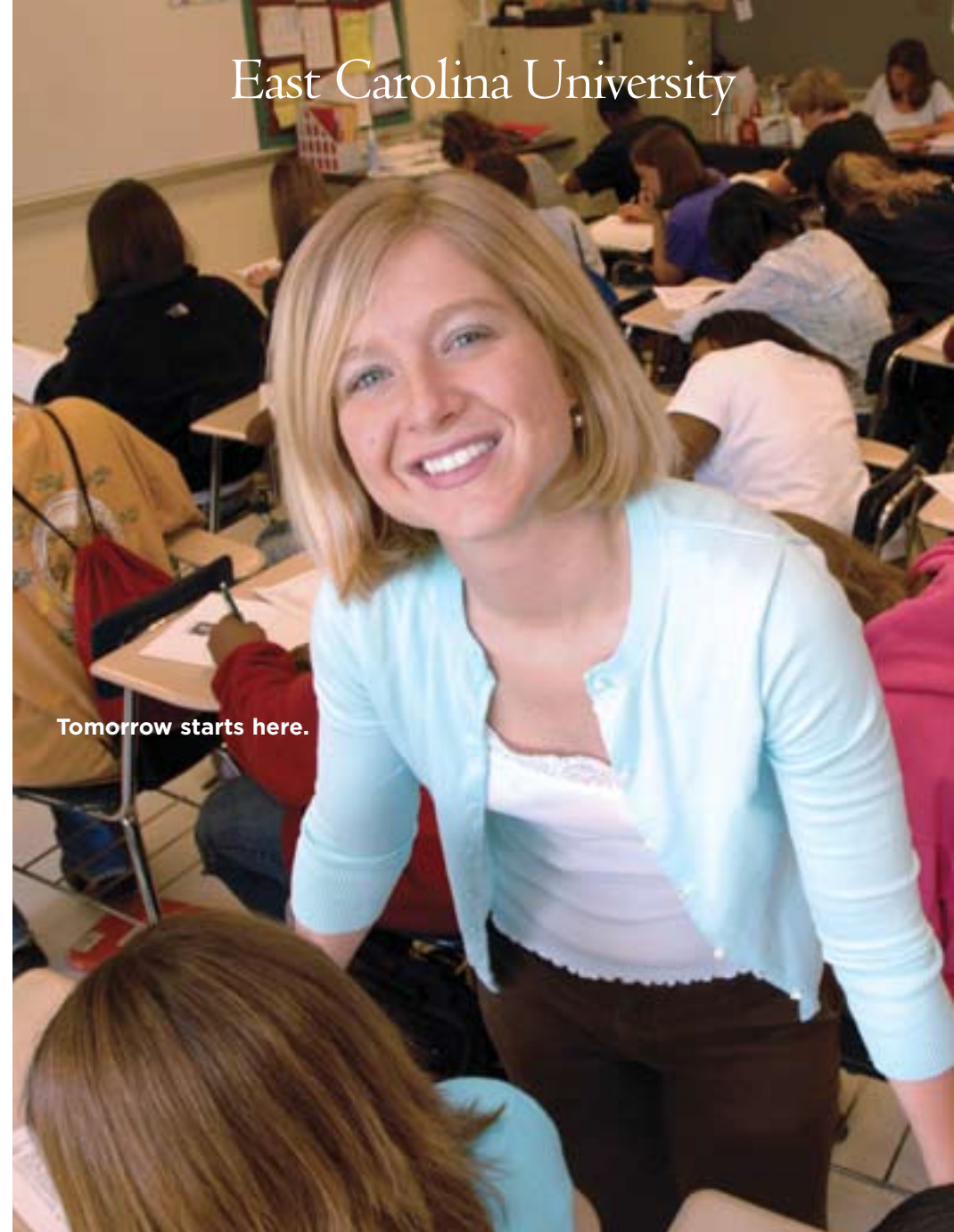

If you're more interested in working with students in grades six through nine, choose the program in middle grades education. That program offers a BS degree, an MAEd degree, and an MAT degree. The BS in middle grades education program is offered both on campus and by distance education through Wachovia Partnership East (WPE). If you are an English education major, you may pursue a BS in English, secondary education. In partnership with the public schools, our program provides comprehensive English education experiences that involve clinical schools. The program is committed to preparing teachers who are knowledgeable and reflective practitioners, technologically advanced, and skilled in meeting the needs of a diverse student population. The program emphasizes improvement of the public schools and assistance in the development and creation of educational policy for North Carolina, as well as support for scholarship and research/creative activity.

The history education program, in partnership with the public schools, provides comprehensive social studies experiences that involve clinical school experiences. The program is committed to preparing teachers who are knowledgeable and reflective practitioners, technologically proficient, and skilled in meeting the needs of a diverse student population. The program places an emphasis on service through faculty participation in the improvement of the public schools and assistance in the development and creation of educational policy for North Carolina, as well as support for scholarship and research/creative activity.

Middle grades education is a nationally award-winning program. If you choose this program, you will prepare for an exciting career of teaching young adolescents. Graduates are licensed to teach in grades six through nine with two academic concentrations. If you are interested in touching the future and inspiring young adolescents, consider a major in middle grades education. In the past five years, all graduates have successfully found rewarding jobs in middle schools within North Carolina and other areas of the United States.
