

The media supervisor/director is a system level media professional who may be identified as Director of Library Media Services, Director of Media and Technology, Coordinator of Library Media Services, or Library Supervisor.

North Carolina requires eligibility to hold the media coordinator (076) certificate plus 12 graduate semester hours of credit in administration, curriculum development, and supervision and three years of acceptable experience as a media coordinator. Students seeking **School Media Supervisor certification (078)** must include **LIBS 7010**, a course in educational curriculum development, and **LIBS 7991**.

The Praxis II in Educational Leadership is required for 078 licensure.

Requirements

LIBS 7010 - Supervision of School Media and Technology Programs

LIBS 7991 - CAS Internship: School Media Supervision Seminar

6 additional hours as selected with the advisor.

Application

Program Eligibility: Students wishing to apply for the Certificate of Advanced Study must have completed a master's degree in library science, or equivalent, with a minimum GPA of 3.0.
