**College gets technology**

TechSmith Corp. announced a gift donation valued at \$5,100 recently to 17 English education graduate students who are working on digital philosophy of education narratives in the College of Education.

Each student recently received a copy of Camtasia Studio 3.0, a full-motion recording software program. It records screen, Webcam video and voice, allowing users to produce professional-quality video presentations with small file sizes to post on the Internet, burn on CD-ROM, or deliver in multiple file formats.

Because of the many distance education courses offered English education majors, and education professors are particularly interested in program's ability to quickly produce learning modules.

Todd Finley, an associate professor of English education, initiated the project after researching the burgeoning digital storytelling movement among teachers across the country.
