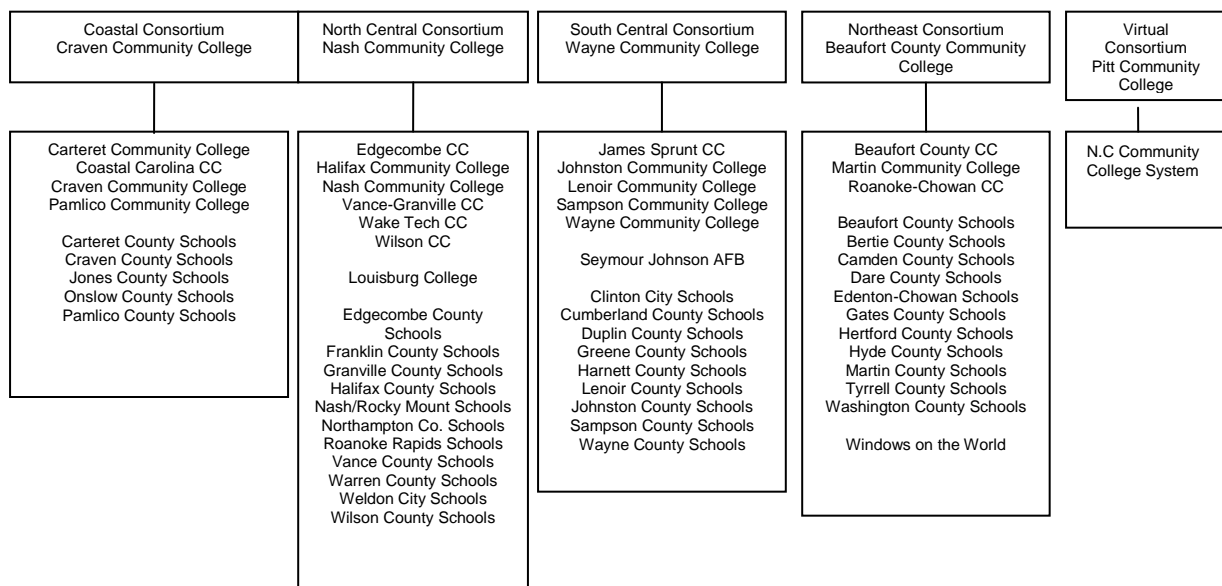

WACHOVIA PARTNERSHIP EAST GENERAL INFORMATION

The B. S. degrees in elementary education, special education-general curriculum, and middle grades education are offered by East Carolina University College of Education through Wachovia Partnership East in partnership with partnering community colleges in eastern North Carolina. Cohorts (group of students who begin and end in the program area together by taking all the classes in the same sequence specifically planned for the group) are offered annually in each degree completion program if an appropriate number of students apply to fill a cohort.

All interested students should take the Praxis I (PPST) exams for reading, writing, and mathematics at the end of their freshman year UNLESS they have met the SAT or ACT requirements listed on page 7 of this application. Registration information for Praxis I (PAPER AND PENCIL VERSION OF THE TEST) may be found online at www.ets.org/praxis. Praxis I tests are available at the Prometric Testing Centers (computer version) in Greenville, Wilmington, Raleigh, or Fayetteville (\$130.00 – subject to change). Prometric Test Center phone numbers are: (252) 756-7427 in Greenville, (910) 392-0891 in Wilmington, (910) 672-1299 in Fayetteville, or (919) 954-1359 in Raleigh.

Admission Requirements for WPE:

1. 2.5 GPA or higher
2. General Education course completion *(see ECU Elementary, Special Education, or Middle Grades articulation agreements on the WPE website at www.ecu.edu/wpe)
* Note: Some coursework must be completed at a North Carolina community college.
3. Praxis I scores within 5 points of passing in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics or qualifying SAT/ACT scores. Test must be taken prior to application being accepted.
4. Completed advising appointment with a WPE coordinator to determine eligibility for program.
5. Admission to East Carolina University. Students must meet ECU transfer requirements or the freshman admission requirements and be admitted to ECU to participate

East Carolina University classes will be delivered using blended course delivery with evening classes at the hub site community college and on-line OR through our virtual hub site. Prior to Senior I and Senior II semesters, students will take up to 6 to 10 hours some semesters and up to 7 hours both summer sessions each summer. Students may be required to quit their jobs or take a leave of absence in order to complete a 15-week (Senior II) full-time internship in the public schools. During the semester (Senior I) prior to the full-time internship, students will be expected to report to their public school assignment one full day each week. Other field experiences related to course work will be required throughout the program, generally requiring 16 to 30 hours in the public schools each semester. The College of Education is committed to delivering the same quality of education to WPE students that students would receive on the main campus at East Carolina University.

DIRECTIONS TO APPLICANT:

1. When completing the application, please type or print clearly.
2. Attach a college transcript from each college you have attended to the application.
3. Students who graduated from high school after 2003 should attach high school transcripts showing freshman minimum admissions requirements were met including completion of 2 consecutive courses of foreign language or a community college transcript verifying successful completion of the foreign language requirement (2 consecutive foreign language courses). See page 8 of this application for ECU admission requirements.
4. Attach a copy of the Praxis I score report that you received from Educational Testing Service. **REQUIRED.** If SAT or ACT scores are used in lieu of Praxis I, a copy of the score report is required. SAT scores may also be verified from high school transcripts.
5. Students enrolled in community college classes during the Spring semester should send a copy of their spring community college semester grades and overall grade point average to the Wachovia Partnership East Coordinator no later than May 30th. Applications will be accepted through the application deadline or until the cohort is filled. Each of the partnering community colleges in the Coastal, North Central, South Central, Northeast and Virtual Consortia will initially be allotted a specific number of slots for students entering a new cohort. These slots will be reserved until the due date for applications. After the due dates of each year, unfilled slots will be filled with the remaining best qualified applicants without regard to the community college they are attending.
6. Candidates will be notified of their acceptance within one month after the application deadline.
7. Please direct questions to your WPE hub site coordinator. The contact information is listed on the second page of this application for each coordinator. It is imperative that applicants have an advising session with a WPE Coordinator prior to applying for a cohort. A determination of eligibility will be discussed at this advising session.
8. Turn in a completed application to the appropriate WPE coordinator by the deadline. **Be sure all required documentation is attached to the application. APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A COPY OF TEST SCORES AND TRANSCRIPTS.** *Return only pages 6-9 of the application. Keep pages 1-5 for your records.*
9. In addition, complete an official ECU application. You must be accepted by ECU in order to be accepted by the programs offered through Wachovia Partnership East. Official ECU applications are located online at www.ecu.edu. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS (Downloaded from ECU online catalog, August 2009)

Freshman

Admission requirements for freshmen are listed below:

1. Official certificate of graduation (or its equivalent) from an accredited secondary school and a satisfactory scholastic record.
2. Fifteen acceptable units of secondary school credit, including in English, four course units emphasizing grammar, composition, and literature; in mathematics, four course units including algebra I, algebra II, geometry and a higher level mathematics course for which algebra II is a prerequisite (fourth unit of mathematics is required of students graduating high school in 2006 and later); in science, three course units, including at least one unit in a life or biological science (for example, biology), at least one unit in a physical science (for example, physical science, chemistry, physics), and at least one other laboratory science course; in foreign language, two course units in same language (two units in foreign language are required of students graduating high school in 2004 and later); and in social studies, two course units, including one unit in US history. East Carolina University recommends that prospective students complete at least one course unit in the arts. Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to individual programs; individual program admission requirements are described in the specific academic sections.
3. Satisfactory scores on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (www.collegeboard.com) or American College Test (www.act.org). Registration forms for either of these examinations are available on line and at individual high schools. Official scores must be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, East Carolina University prior to admission.
4. A nondeductible, nonrefundable application fee of \$60.

Transfer Students

General Transfer

General admission requirements for transfer students are listed below:

1. Official transcript(s) from each regionally accredited college, technical institute, or university previously attended showing the following:
 - a. A 2.5 grade point average (GPA) on all transferable hours attempted. (Some professional schools may require a GPA which is higher than that required by the university for admission to their programs.)
 - b. Honorable dismissal and eligibility to return to the college or university at which last matriculated. (Attendance only at summer school or evening school does not apply.)
 - c. Students with 30 or more transferable hours from a regionally accredited institution are not required to provide a high school transcript or general educational development tests (GED) certificate.
2. Nondeductible, nonrefundable application fee of \$60.

Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to individual programs. Individual program admission requirements are described in the specific academic sections. It is the student's responsibility to request that all transcripts and other records be forwarded to the admissions office.

NOTE: Transfer students must meet the University of North Carolina subject matter admission requirements by completing high school courses as stated above, or by completing 6 degree-creditable semester hours each in English, mathematics, science, foreign language, and social sciences at a regionally-accredited institution other than East Carolina University. Those graduating from high school in 2004 must also have 6 hours of foreign language to satisfy the MCR requirements. (See Admission Requirements, Freshmen.) In addition, those who present fewer than 30 s.h. (45 q.h.) of transferable credits with a minimum GPA of 2.5 must have satisfactory high school grades and test scores to qualify as freshmen.

Transfer with Associate Degree

Admission of transfer students with an associate degree is based on the following criteria.

1. The applicant must have earned the associate of arts, associate of science, or associate of fine arts degree with a cumulative 2.5 GPA or higher.
2. The applicant must have earned the degree from a regionally-accredited institution.
3. The applicant must have earned a minimum of 16 s.h. or 23 q.h. at the institution conferring the degree.
