

## Component D: Technology Skills

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### Elements

Component D of your portfolio will consist of verification of advanced technology competencies completed in either EDTC 4001 (undergraduate students), EDTC 5010 (licensure only students) or the designated program specific course, such as MUSC 2123. The required verification will be documented by the printed transcript feature from OneStop that displays a final grade of C or better in the above named appropriate course.

### Introduction

Effective April 1999, all beginning teachers who apply for a Standard Professional 1 license in North Carolina must demonstrate technology competencies. The Technology Committee for the NC department of Public Instruction reviewed the technology standards of the [International Society of Technology in Education \(ISTE\)](#). The committee concluded that these standards for beginning teachers represented the knowledge, skills, and dispositions that beginning teachers in NC should be expected to possess. They recommend that the ISTE Standards be adopted for use in North Carolina, and in March 2002, the NC State Board of Education approved the adoption of the standards.

Candidates for the Standard Professional 1 license will construct a portfolio that contains artifacts, which evidence their mastery of each technology competency. Basic competencies will be mastered through the successful completion of ASIP 2000 (or approved comparable course). Advanced technology competencies will be verified by the course instructor of record with documented final approval on the course checklist and a final course grade of C or better.

Although the technology portfolio will contain artifacts documenting the ISTE standards, evidence of mastery should also appear throughout the candidate's senior year experience. Progress reports and other portfolio components will also document the application of advanced competencies in classroom settings.

### Procedures

The documentation of technology competencies will be the printed transcript from OneStop showing the candidate's appropriate technology course grade of C or better. Candidates will go to OneStop, click on Banner Self Service, click on Student and Financial Aid, click on Student Records, then click on Academic Transcript (under Academic Records) and print. Place the transcript, **with the page displaying your technology course grade on top**, in your portfolio in the section labeled Component D: Technology Skills.
