How Do I Earn My Degree?

You can graduate from East Carolina University with a BS degree leading to licensure by completing the first two years of the program at any one of our partnering community colleges. You complete the second half of the program by taking East Carolina courses online or through face-to-face instruction with East Carolina instructors at one of the consortia hub sites. You also have the option of 100 percent online delivery through the Virtual Consortium housed at Pitt Community College.

Please note: An internship (student teaching) will require a 15-week commitment of observing, assisting, and teaching daily in a local public school.

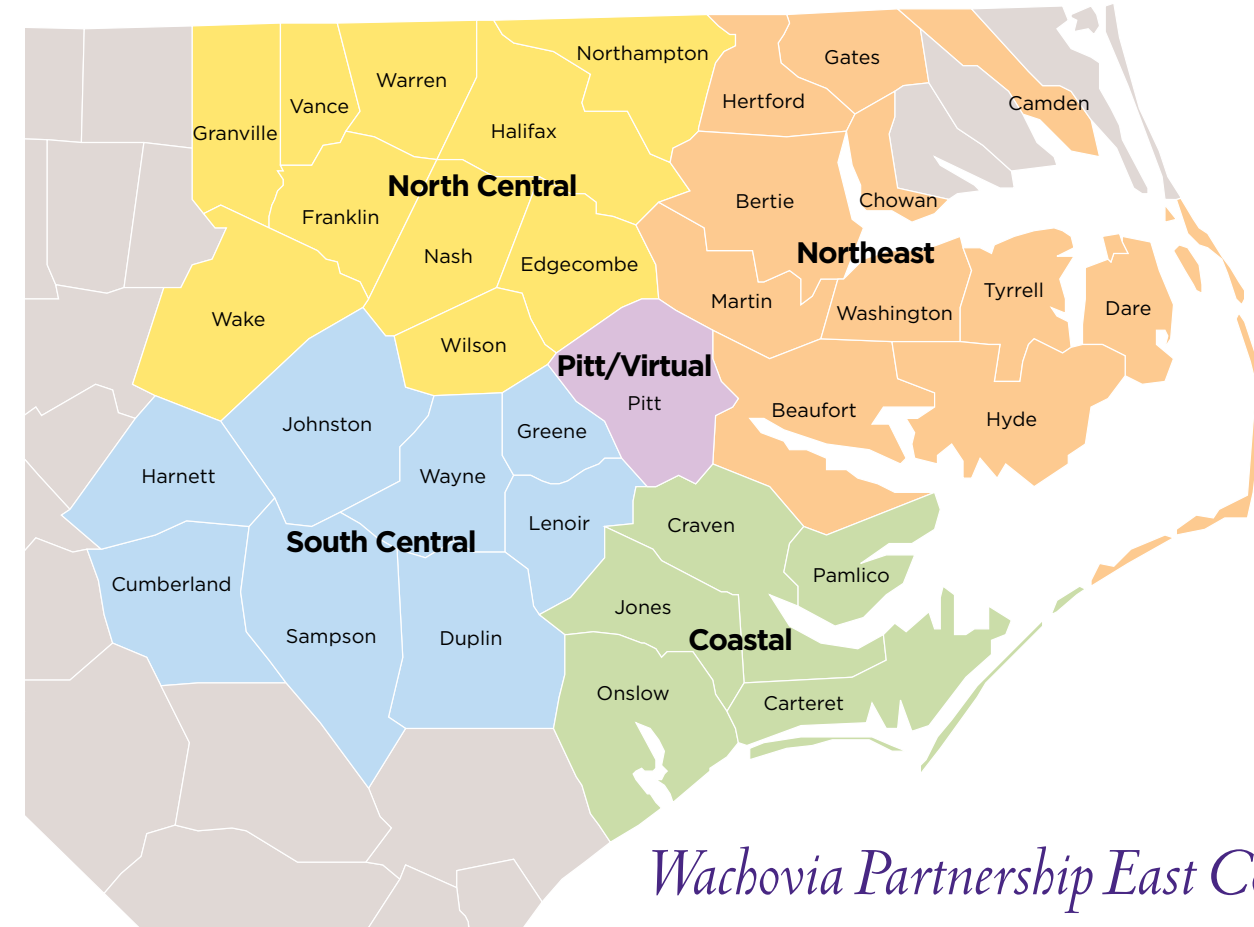
What If I Already Have a Four-Year Degree?
