### Passing Scores for the Praxis I:

COMPOSITE SCORE for passing PRAXIS I = Total of 522

OR Math 173, Reading 176 and Writing 173 (minimum scores for each section)

OR SAT in lieu of Praxis I is a total score of 1100 + (the writing portion does not count in any way)

OR ACT in lieu of Praxis I is a total score of 24 +

OR score of 550 + on the math portion of the SAT in place of math portion for Praxis I

OR score of 24 + on math portion of the SAT in place of math portion for Praxis I

OR score of 550 + on the verbal portion of the SAT in place of reading and writing portion for Praxis I

OR score of 24 + on the verbal portion of the ACT in place of reading and writing portion for Praxis I

### COMPOSITE SCORE for passing PRAXIS I... what does this mean?

1. Students who take all three tests and the highest three tests add up to 522 or more are considered to have passing Praxis I scores.

2. There are no longer minimum scores required on each test (when using the composite scoring)

EXAMPLE: Reading 175; Math 174; and Writing 173 = Total of 522... student is eligible for Upper Division!

3. This is true for students who took these tests before this ruling and for those who take it after the ruling. ANYONE who has a TOTAL score of 522 or more is eligible!
