Students entering the health education and promotion degree program choose one of two concentrations: community health or worksite health promotion.

Worksite Health Promotion Concentration

Students entering the worksite health promotion concentration must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and a minimum GPA of 2.5 calculated on four courses: PSYC 3241; FINA 2244; EHST 3100; and HLTH 2000. Students must complete an interview with appropriate health faculty.

Community Health Concentration

The community health concentration requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 for entry and thereafter the student must retain a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the required cognates and pass all health education core courses with a minimum grade of C. A student earning a D in any of these courses must petition the Department of Health Education and Promotion for probationary continuation. No student on probation may enroll for HLTH 4992, Community Health Internship.

Minimum degree requirement is 126 s.h. of credit as follows*:

- 1) General education requirements.....42 s.h.
- 2) Common Core Courses.....34 s.h.
- 3) Concentration Area (choose one).....25-27 s.h.
 - A. Community Health (27 s.h.)
 - B. Worksite Health Promotion (25 s.h.)
- 4) Electives: It is recommended that courses be taken which reinforce content in the physical, social, and behavioral sciences, or provide the student with a community health specialty area such as gerontology, environmental health, or health promotion.
