

## **RECREATION AND LEISURE STUDIES POLICIES**

### **I. RCLS ADMISSION POLICY** as noted in the ECU Undergraduate Catalog.

Students wishing to declare a major in Recreation and Leisure Studies, at the time of entrance into the curriculum, need to possess a minimum overall GPA of 2.0; have no more than 10 s.h. of general education remaining; have completed a brief, written application (available at [www.ecu.edu/rcls](http://www.ecu.edu/rcls)); and have a meeting with a RCLS faculty member.

Contact the MRFS Program Director, Dr. Cheryl Estes, or the RT Program Director, Dr. David Loy, to set up an appointment.

### **II. RCLS RETENTION POLICY** as noted in the ECU Undergraduate Catalogs.

Any student majoring in Recreation and Leisure Studies must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all major courses to remain in good standing. A minimum grade of C must be earned in all RCLS prefix courses. MRFS majors must have a “C” or better in Math 1065 or 1066 before beginning their senior year. Students failing to meet the retention criteria will not be allowed to enroll in any additional RCLS prefix courses until the criteria has been met. The only exception being students enrolling in RCLS prefix courses in which the student has less than a C grade.

### **III. RCLS PREREQUISITES** as noted in the ECU Undergraduate Catalog.

- Students need to be declared RCLS majors/minors prior to enrolling in RCLS courses at the 3000 level and above. Refer to the Undergraduate Catalog for more information on prerequisites.
- RCLS 2000 must be completed with a grade of C or better in order to enroll in RCLS courses at the 3000 level and above.
- RCLS 4902 is to be taken during the final semester prior to RCLS 4990 Internship placement. Students are not permitted to enroll in additional courses (either at ECU or elsewhere) during the semester they are enrolled in RCLS 4990.
