Mike often shares how grateful he is for the education he received at ECU. His interest in his alma mater has blossomed into a passion to give back and he gives back in many ways. As a consequence of the many scholarships that he funds, students in our College and other units at ECU are able to continue to pursue their educations. In 1974 and again in 2003, Mike Bunting received the prestigious Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his outstanding and uncommon service to the University and his ability to serve as a role model for students and faculty alike. The Bunting Track and Field was dedicated in his honor in 1976. He shares his strong leadership talents with ECU and our College, serving on several councils and committees. We are grateful for his long-term membership on the College of HHP Dean's Advancement Council. He began serving a two year term as vice-chair of the Council in 2006, and then will become chair.

It was East Carolina University's good fortune that Mike was close friends with Robert Galphin because it was Galphin who brought Mike to ECU. After growing up in Greensboro, Mike attended Wilmington Junior College with plans to transfer to Appalachian State University. Robert decided to attend ECU and he and his sister offered to share their apartment and living expenses with Mike. Mike accepted the offer and comments that, "ECU was good to me and I was always treated as an equal."

HHP 2007 Outstanding Alumnus: Dr. Joe Nelson



We are pleased to announce Dr. Joe Nelson as the 2007 College of Health and Human Performance Outstanding Alumnus. A Pitt County native, Joe is three times a Pirate having earned a BA in Physical Education ('80), MA in Educational Administration ('85), and EdD in Educational Leadership ('93). Dr. Nelson began his career 27 years ago as a physical education teacher and coach at Bertie Senior High School, Windsor, NC. Since that time he has served as teacher, assistant principal, and principal at several Pitt County Schools. He has also directed grants and research, licensed personnel and has worked in the NC Department of Public Instruction. Presently, the Principal of Stokes Elementary School, Dr. Nelson has a strong record of community service.

Dr. Joe Nelson embodies his alma mater's motto, "To serve." He has been honored by the NC Department of Public Instruction and the NC General Assembly and was named the 1991-1992 Pitt County Schools' Teacher of the Year. He continues to give back to ECU

in many ways, including assisting with student teaching placement and guest lecturing in a variety of classes. He is a role model for our students and a valued colleague of HHP faculty.



Message from the Dean

Greetings from all of us in the College of HHP. We are off to an outstanding year with the addition of a number of new faculty members. ECU official numbers put the institution just 10 students shy of 26,000. This growth is important for ECU and HHP but does strain our facilities and faculty. In recognition of the importance of health and fitness to good academics, all ECU students are required to complete both an EXSS course and a HE&P course. Yes, we still administer the swimming test! This makes ECU special in our commitment to the health of our students but requires a significant commitment to accomplish this for all students.

The College of HHP faculty continue to receive recognition for their teaching, research and service proportionately well above our number. The most prestigious awards went to Matt Mahar (Board of Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching) as the outstanding teacher on campus; Jim Decker (University Excellence in Service) for his exceptional service; and Sharon Knight as the outstanding woman leader on campus (Dr. Linda Allred Profile in Leadership award). Each received the highest award in the category for which it was given.

As we mark the ECU Centennial, our HHP Advancement Council, Chaired by Don Edwards, will be working this year to address our scholarship and facility needs. One issue the Council is examining is the future of Christenbury Memorial Gymnasium. We have

planned a number of very special activities for this centennial year, which are discussed elsewhere in the Newsletter.

The departments of Health Education and Promotion, and Recreation and Leisure Studies will soon move into the re-furnished Belk building and we will have a grand opening event in spring 2008. Special thanks goes to Bill Cain and Stephen Atkinson for keeping this project moving along on schedule. It is a sign of the tremendous growth of the institution and our college, that despite this fine new addition, we will still have unmet facility needs for the college. Especially noteworthy is the lack of gym/activity space for the college. It is significant to note that EXSS by some measures is among the best in the country while having proportionately the least amount of gym space in the state.

The College is proud to name Mr. Joe Nelson, Outstanding Alumnus for 2007. Joe is a graduate of EXSS and is the highly regarded principal of Stokes Elementary School.

Thank you for your continued interest in ECU and HHP. Your success, energy and support continue to be our greatest assets in advancing the College of Health and Human Performance.

After graduation in 1961, Mike taught social studies at New Hanover High School in Wilmington. In 1962, he was offered a job to return to Greensboro as a sales representative for the same rubber and gasket distribution company that he had worked part time for during his high school and college years. In 1963, Mike co-founded and served as Vice-President of CGR Products in Greensboro. In 1985, Mike founded and is President of Rubber-Mill, a manufacturer of rubber components for machinery and equipment. The manufacturing facility is located in Liberty, North Carolina and the warehousing facility is located in Greensboro.

Mike admires the beauty of gardens and has traveled extensively in the United States and Canada in his quest to build a botanical garden at ECU for the exhibition and scientific study of plants. When asked how his interest in gardens was cultivated, he commented, "My parents always had the best looking yard in the neighborhood." This interest motivated Mike to donate the crape myrtle tree, otherwise known as the "pirate tree," located in the Minges Coliseum patio area.

Mike Bunting has given much to the students and faculty in the College and at ECU. He is praised by colleagues and friends for his generosity, strong spirit, and extraordinary commitment. HHP is extremely grateful for Mike's contributions to the students in our college. As Dean Glen Gilbert stated, "Mike has a passion for ECU that is infectious. His love for this institution is clear in every outspoken comment he makes. If we had a thousand more alumni like him we would be the best at almost everything."

Ms. Judy Henderson received the 2007 Alumni Award of the Parks, Recreation, and Leisure Studies Professional Society, a chapter of the ECU Alumni Society. The award was presented at the North Carolina Recreational Therapy Association (NCRTA) Annual Conference held in October 2007 in Greenville, N.C. Alumni **Kimberly Stewart** and **Emily Carlyle** received Certificates of Recognition from NCRTA at the conference.

Department Chair Updates

Peter Farrell, PhD Chair, Department of Exercise and Sport Science

The Department of Exercise and Sport Science continues to contribute to the overall success of HHP. We welcomed many new faculty to the department, including Dr. Kathy Davis, Dr. Tina Karvinen, Dr. Matt Walker, Dr. Melanie Sartore, Dr. Bomna Ko, Dr. Donghai Zheng, Mr. Paul Zalewski and Mr. Patrick Rider. Our faculty have rededicated themselves to providing the best possible experience for our students both in formal classes and informal settings such as laboratory and internship experiences. Dr. Matt Mahar received the 2007 North Carolina Board of Governors Award for Excellence in Teaching, the most prestigious teaching award given to only one ECU faculty member each year. Matt's presentation during the awards ceremony was superb. Dr. Tom Raedeke received one of the UNC Board of Governor's Distinguished Professor for Teaching Awards and Dr. Scott Gordon received the HHP Scholar – Teacher Award and was a finalist for the 2007 University Alumni Award for Outstanding Teaching.

The new Sport Studies undergraduate degree program is attracting many good students. Dr. Mark Moore is developing a new dual master's degree program between the M.S. in Sport Management and MBA in the College of Business. Mr. Clint Etheridge's scuba program was named as the best university-based scuba teaching program in the nation by NAUI. NAUI is a national scuba certification group.

Dr. Jim Decker was recognized with the 2007 Centennial Award for Excellence in Service, an award given to only one faculty member at ECU. Through the work primarily of Rhonda Kenny and Matt Mahar, the department initiated a new research-based service oriented program evaluating an after school program. They seek to determine how the inclusion of physical activity and better nutrition affects the health status of children aged 5-12 years. This program provides valuable hands on experience for our Health Fitness Specialists majors.

The Human Performance Laboratory reached an all time high in federal external funding for research and is ranked as the number one unit at ECU in this regard. An external group, evaluated all doctoral programs at ECU and ranked the Bioenergetics program (an interdisciplinary program with Physiology and Biochemistry and is housed in EXSS) as the best doctoral degree program on campus. Finally, for the first time in our history, one of our programs broke into a top 10 national ranking. In the area of Kinesiology/Exercise Science, Academic Analytics Inc. (published in the Chronicle of Higher Education) ranked our doctoral program in Bioenergetics as the seventh best in the nation. This ranking was primarily based on faculty productivity and quality of our students. Our program was the only one in North Carolina to be ranked in the top ten.

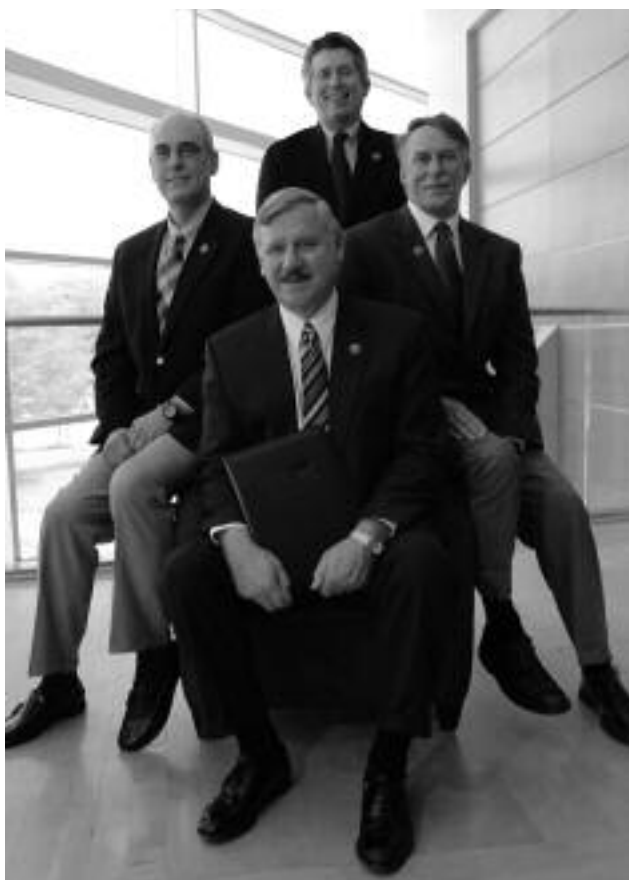

Drs. David Loy and Richard Williams co-edited Abstracts for the 2007 American Therapeutic Recreation Association Research Institute, a publication distributed at the 2007 ATRA annual conference.

over 200 undergraduate majors and over 150 graduate students. The MS in Athletic Training began accepting students this year. We recently received approval to on-line delivery of the MS in Environmental Health, aimed at providing a graduate degree opportunity for practicing professionals in the field. The new program is anticipated to begin by Fall, 2008. Faculty and students continue to be pleased with the development of distance education programs. Our on-line programs are serving an important role in helping our practicing professionals advance their education without leaving their professional positions.

Faculty continue to receive external funding for research and service efforts. We have been funded to promote a tobacco-free campus at ECU through the NC Health and Wellness Trust Fund. A local agency and a local industry have supported our faculty in addressing water quality issues. The NC State Board of Education is funding faculty to create educational programs about HIV prevention for school administrators. We are working with others in the university

to address health and educational disparities in eastern NC. Still other funded research deals with mentoring women physicians. Several faculty have proposals under review. It is very exciting to see the progress we are making in our research and external funding efforts.

Let me close with a wonderful bit of news about the work of our HLTH 1000 faculty and graduate teaching assistants. Each semester the EXSS 1000 and HLTH 1000 Blood Challenge generates the highest number of pints of blood donated on our campus. We were the recipient of the American Red Cross College Campus Award for 2006-2007!
