ECU Libraries provide library instruction sessions for all undergraduate and graduate classes in-person or via distance education.

### East Campus - Joyner Library

Joyner Library provides library instruction sessions for all undergraduate and graduate classes in-person or via distance education. ECU faculty members and instructors may request course-related research sessions for their classes. These sessions are taught by librarians who tailor the content for the specific class assignment or the students' research needs. Library instruction sessions can cover:

- Library's Catalog
- 300+ Subscription Databases (ex. JSTOR, ERIC, & PsycINFO)
- Effective Search Strategies
- Evaluating Sources (ex. Popular vs. Scholarly Resources; Websites)

Please allow two weeks notice to ensure adequate preparation time.
