Application Supplement

Residents of Jarvis Hall are involved, successful, civic-minded students who are dedicated to enhancing their personal growth and leadership development. Throughout the year, they interact with successful community members and civic leaders as well as participate in interactive workshops, leadership seminars, skill training, and service learning. Qualifications to get into Jarvis Leadership Program:

- Completed Application (Online and Supplement), 2 Letters of Reference
- Minimum high school GPA of 3.0
- Plan to participate in a Jarvis Leadership COAD 1000 – 1 credit course

Qualifications to stay in the program additional years:

- Must successfully complete leadership curriculum during the academic year
- The curriculum consists of participating in an organized leadership program and also participating in activities within the residence hall (socials, educational programs, lectures, community service activities.) Detailed information on the leadership curriculum will be given to residents when they move into Jarvis in August.
- If you are accepted to the Leadership Program: Jarvis Residents must also enroll in COAD-1000, (1 credit: Student Development and Learning in Higher Education), scheduled for Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6pm-6:50pm. We will pre-register you for this course. Please do not drop this course from your schedule.
- Maintain a semester GPA of 2.5 and cumulative GPA of 2.75

Application Process:

In addition to the online application filled out on the Onestop (onestop.ecu.edu) web site, be prepared to submit.

 - These two questions can be submitted in a Microsoft Word or PDF Document to JarvisLeadership@ecu.edu . Make sure you include your name and banner ID with your submission.

What leadership activities have you been involved in within the last 2 years? How have these activities made you the person you are today? (minimum 250 words)

What skills, abilities, or experiences can you offer the program? In addition, what skills do you hope to enhance as being part of Jarvis Leadership Hall? (minimum of 250 words).
