The annual Fall Career Fair at ECU will be held at Minges Coliseum on October 20, 2005 from 10:00 AM-2:00 PM. The Career Fair provides an opportunity for students from all majors and backgrounds to interact with over 350 recruiters from 150 organizations.

Last year, 4,000 students and 851 recruiters from 426 organizations attended on-campus career fairs. Of the recruiters that participated in the career fairs, 94% of them stated that their experience at ECU was equal to or better than other universities.
