**Founding board member (23 years) for a human service transit system that  
transports the handicapped and others seeking services from Pitt Community  
College, the major human service organizations, and the Eastern Carolina  
Vocational Center. I was directly involved in the day to day operation in the  
oversight of a contractor providing the drivers and service. I wrote grants to the  
State of North Carolina and I also filed the necessary reporting statistics for this  
program.**

**Supervision of the Emergency Management Coordinator and 911 Center Director -**  
Supervised the day to day operation of these two functions. The department included fire inspection and investigation, operation of two County EMS stations, coordination of eight non-profit EMS squads, receiving and allocating of resources to all emergency situations (911 calls). Additionally, the Emergency Management Coordinator serves as the ultimate authority for the allocation of State resources in times of disasters such as hurricanes and floods. The position makes all decisions on sheltering of those in need and provides for the general welfare of the citizens during any emergency. I personally served in the capacity of EMS director during Hurricane Isabel as this was a vacant position for five months and worked in supporting roles in many other emergencies during my 23 year career in this position. In addition to my normal duties in the Emergency Operation Center, I established and operated the main receiving, distribution, and warehouse for all supplies sent by State agencies and private donations during the major event of Hurricane Floyd.

**Agricultural Liaison –**

Served as liaison to all Federal agricultural agencies (Farm Services, Soil & Water, Farmers Home), Agriculture Extension, and was a Board member on the Mid-East Resource and Development Board for 13 years. I also managed the County's farmland that was in the USDA soil bank.

**Work Force Development Consortium Chairman, Region Q –**

Oversaw planning and reporting for the five county regions for the Work Force Development Program.

**Criminal Justice Partnership Director –**

Received funding for developing programs for class I felons. Initially, programming was developed as a public service and employment service for this class of felon and was later changed to meet the need for the provision of sex offender treatment and addiction treatment programs for this class of non-incarcerated felon. The program won a State award for excellence last year.

**Safety Director –**

Developed a multi-departmental safety plan (in conjunction with a consultant) and established a functional working safety committee. I addressed several OSHA incidents to the State's satisfaction during my tenure.

**United Way Campaign Director-**

United Way dollars raised were only \$2,000 in 1984 and during my tenure the contributions rose to over \$35,000 from a workforce of 500 individuals during the 1990's. I also served on the United Way Board of Directors for two full terms.

**Community Development Block Grant Coordinator –**

**Developed the County's Community Board Grant program before there was a Planning Department. I was successful in bringing in four grants over a period of six years totaling \$2,400,000 and helping bring adequate housing, streets, water, and sewer to many elderly and impoverished homeowners.**

**Aging Funds Coordinator –**

**Supervised the distribution, allocation, and reporting for the Home and Community Block Grant for the Aging for Pitt County.**

**Miscellaneous –**

**Served on many boards, commissions, and special projects during my public service career. They run from developing a shooting range for Pitt Community College, developing an aging plan, special EMS plans, and many others. As the County grew during my service, I served in many other roles that are now departments such as being the first personnel officer, ADA Officer and an urban planner. My experiences are varied and most challenges have been met successfully. I strongly believe that given sufficient resources, there is a way to provide services to the public in a professional and cost efficient manner to the satisfaction of the ultimate consumer, the citizen.**
