As Director of Institutional Planning, Research, and Effectiveness (and as Director of Planning and Institutional Research and Chief of Staff to the Chancellor)

My responsibilities in these roles have changed significantly over the years. As director of planning and institutional research my office was responsible for doing most of the usual tasks assigned to such an office. In addition to the usual institutional research assignments, however, I was also placed in charge of the university's strategic planning process, its enrollment projections process, and represented the Chancellor's Office in university budget planning. Through these roles, I became heavily involved in campus space planning and was responsible for coordinating the assignment of space on campus. In addition, I managed the budgets of the various offices reporting to the Chancellor as well as his discretionary account. When appropriate, presentations on enrollment trends and campus planning issues to the Board of Trustees and other public bodies were also made.

After my appointment as chief of staff to the Chancellor, responsibility for coordinating the activities of the various other offices reporting to the Chancellor was added to the above-described duties. This new coordination involved reporting their activities to the Chancellor,

managing their personnel paperwork, and overseeing their budgets. It also included representing the Chancellor at a variety of meetings.

Upon completion of my assignment as interim vice chancellor, my duties have been expanded significantly in the new role of director of institutional planning, research, and effectiveness. The staff has doubled in size; the budget tripled. In addition to being responsible for the institutional research and planning activities noted above, the Offices of Campus Space Planning and Institutional Effectiveness have now been added to my duties. This new arrangement brings together a critical mass of talent and resources to support the university's future development.

In November 2003, I was also assigned responsibility for overseeing campus economic development and community engagement activities. This includes Regional Developmental Institute, the Survey Research Lab, Small Business and Technology Development Center, the Office of Community Engagement, and the Japan Center East. During this time we have worked to develop closer ties with regional economic development officers and organizations. We have secured more than \$300,000 in grants and local funding support for these activities

Among the major accomplishments during my tenure in these roles are:

- Steered the campus through two five-year strategic planning processes and currently in the beginning stage of a third process.
- Co-chaired the development of the campus master plan.
- Participated in the development of plans for new campus buildings.
- Aided in the development of new academic programs, including Ph.D. programs in Bioenergetics, Nursing, Coastal Resource Management, and Biomedical Physics, as well as undergraduate programs with Engineering being the most recent
- Coordinated the implementation of a campus space planning processes
- Implemented campus institutional effectiveness processes
- Developed a pilot project for establishing an ECU presence in Washington, DC to secure new federal funding
- Worked to establish the Entrepreneurial Initiative
- Partnered with other UNC institutions in establishing Institute for Community Engagement and Development

As Interim Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs

East Carolina University is a public doctoral research-intensive university of 20,500 students. As interim vice chancellor for academic affairs from April 2001 through July 2002, I was responsible for the full range of activities and duties expected of a chief academic officer. The budget for the Division of Academic Affairs exceeded \$100 million, its faculty FTE exceeded 900, and 11 deans and directors of major university functions reported directly to me. On ECU's campus all of the university's academic programs except for Allied Health Sciences, Nursing, and Medicine reported to the Office of the VCAA. These include the university's enrollment management office and various supporting units such as Admissions, Registrar, and Financial Aid.

Despite the 2001-2002 academic years being ones of great financial uncertainty in which over 10 percent of the university's funds were returned to the state in one-time cuts, the Division of Academic Affairs was able to make significant progress in a number of areas:

- Worked successfully to secure reconfirmation of reaccreditation by the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges, with particular emphasis on the creation and funding of an Office of Institutional Effectiveness and the establishment of an appropriate on-going institutional effectiveness program.
- Increased, in conjunction with the Division of Continuing Studies and Summer School, the summer school pay for faculty from a maximum of \$8,000 per full-time load to 16.4 percent of the faculty member's nine-month salary.
- Worked with the Division of Student Life to merge the academic and student life divisions
- Co-chaired a task force that developed first periodic evaluation system for university administrators
- Worked with Divisions of Administration and Finance and Institutional Advancement as well as International Studies and the Department of Interior Design to establish, renovate, and furnish an International House to serve as a residence for visiting international scholars.
- Negotiated working arrangements for the establishment of new Bioenergetics Ph.D. program with the School of Medicine.
- Negotiated the transfer of several academic programs to new homes within the university.
- Led growth in distance education enrollments of approximately 25 percent.
- Strengthened the enrollment management function of the university through clarification of roles, expectations, and working relationships.
- Worked with the School of Education to expand university's connections with surrounding community colleges through the evolution of a hub concept to meet the teacher education shortage in eastern North Carolina.

- Participated in the development of the university's upcoming centennial campaign priorities.
- Initiated campus discussion of the applicability of the Community of Scholars concept to the university.
- Increased the diversity of academic affairs through the hiring of new minority administrators.

During my service as chair of the Department of Political Science, the unit had approximately 250 majors and 15 faculty members, offering the B.S., B.A., and M.P.A. degrees. As department chair, I was responsible for the usual range of departmental chair activities such as managing the departmental budget, recruiting new faculty, scheduling classes, evaluating faculty, making personnel recommendations, hearing student issues, and representing the concerns of the department to senior administrators. In addition, during my tenure the department vigorously pursued NASPA accreditation for its MPA degree. This was granted several months later.
