<u>Discussion:</u> Angela brought this up to Academic Council and suggested that the faculty should be surveyed on this matter in order to obtain appropriate feedback from the campus community. Various scenarios were discussed on how to provide a longer break around Christmas while ensuring that there are still breaks between the Spring and Summer semesters and the Summer and Fall semesters. The pros and cons of extending the break at Christmas were discussed. The main idea discussed is to have a 10-week summer session instead of 11-week and two 5-week summer sessions instead of two 5.5-week. This should leave

the 1 week break between Spring and Summer semesters and around a 3 week break in August while extending the break around the Christmas holiday to 4 weeks. Before any change is made to the calendar the faculty and students will be surveyed for appropriate feedback.

Action Taken: No action taken as the committee is still exploring the feasibility of changing the calendar.

<u>Assigned additional duties to:</u> Mark will begin drafting potential calendars to see what is feasible. Angela will check with Academic Council and others.
