New Business (Stacy Weiss)

1. Multidisciplinary Concentrations

Discussion concerning how multidisciplinary concentrations will appear in the course catalog.

- Advantages to concentrations appearing on their own page: simpler presentation makes it easier for students to understand requirements and course offerings; more visibility for the concentration.
- Disadvantages to concentration appearing on their own page: potential for students to mistakenly think that the name of the concentration will appear on their degree when in fact only the name of the multidisciplinary program appears; this goes against established precedent in Music and Foreign Languages, where the concentrations are listed on the same page as the umbrella dgree; difficulties in implementing this change with the current catalog software system.
