o Hosted on August 14 for new faculty. Successful, positive energy, and engaged faculty!

# Budget updates (mostly taken directly from Lewis' email):

- o Enrollment and total student credit hours at ECU were down this fall. Under the new funding model, cuts are imposed the same year as the decline, so ECU will have a permanent budget cut of about \$5 million for FY2019. The cut for Academic Library Services is \$63,000.
- We did receive a one-time allocation of \$110,000 to replace the front doors to the library. The project will take about six weeks, so it will be scheduled to begin after the spring semester ends in early May.
- The Virtual Library fund is underfunded by about \$600,000. By using endowment income, which has been cautiously managed over the last few years, and other sources of one-time funding, we have determined that we can commit to new three-year licenses with several of our largest e-journal vendors. If sufficient permanent recurring budget increases are not provided to the Virtual Library by FY2022, serious cuts will have to be made to e-journals subscriptions and other library resources.
- o Textbook affordability: Our textbook affordability programs continue to help students succeed while saving them money. Potential student savings exceeded \$350,000 in 2017-2018. This fall, nearly 150 classes will have access to free online versions of one or more of their required texts, thanks to Library purchases of ebook versions of the books. 45 faculty members from 23 departments have participated in the Alternative Textbook Mini-Grant program since 2016. It will continue this academic year, while we also participate in a new statewide initiative called Open Education North Carolina. This NC LIVE initiative aims to reduce the cost of textbooks in 30 of the most frequently-taught college courses across North Carolina's 2 & 4-year colleges and universities through the creation and adoption of free, open textbooks. Open textbooks ensure a level playing field, with access to all students on day one. They can also be updated more frequently and customized to include relevant examples and assignments.

- 95% of faculty are "satisfied" or "very satisfied" with the ECU Libraries' staff interaction/customer service
- $\circ$  The highest average rating on the graduate student exit survey -4.6 was for "Effectiveness of online library resources for your learning experience."

This may be an issue beyond the library alone, but impacts students trying to study who have to leave Laupus and relocate to Joyner.
